Chairman Gossage and Members of the senate Public Health & Welfare Committee,

I am submitting my testimony in support of SB391. I fully support the provisions made in this bill. The removal of authoritative powers from the secretary of health and environment is a step in the right direction. After the atrocities that happened during the COVID-19 era, this bill helps return personal responsibility back to the people. It's not up to the secretary of health to force myself to take a vaccination or to be forcefully quarantined.
