
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2746 by House Committee on Health and Human Services

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2746 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2746 would increase the educational requirements of dieticians in Kansas by 100 clinical hours to meet the nationally accepted standards of education for the dietician field of work.

According to the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services, enactment of HB 2746 would have no fiscal effect on the agency. The bill would align Kansas standards with national changes that have already been made at the national level. KDADS would not expect an increase or decrease in the number of dieticians the agency would license.
