AN ACT concerning education; relating to the Kansas school equity and
 enhancement act; authorizing the use of current-year student enrollment
 to determine state foundation aid; amending K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 72 5132 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 72-5132 is hereby amended to read as
follows: 72-5132. As used in the Kansas school equity and enhancement
act, K.S.A. 72-5131 et seq., and amendments thereto:

10 (a) "Adjusted enrollment" means the enrollment of a school district, 11 excluding the remote enrollment determined pursuant to K.S.A. 2022 12 Supp. 72-5180, and amendments thereto, adjusted by adding the following 13 weightings, if any, to the enrollment of a school district: At-risk student 14 weighting; bilingual weighting; career technical education weighting; high-density at-risk student weighting; high enrollment weighting; low 15 16 enrollment weighting; school facilities weighting; ancillary school facilities weighting; cost-of-living weighting; special education and related 17 18 services weighting; and transportation weighting.

(b) "Ancillary school facilities weighting" means an addend
component assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to
K.S.A. 72-5158, and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable
to commencing operation of one or more new school facilities by such
school districts.

(c) (1) "At-risk student" means a student who is eligible for free
meals under the national school lunch act, and who is enrolled in a school
district that maintains an approved at-risk student assistance program.

(2) "At-risk student" does not include any student enrolled in any of
the grades one through 12 who is in attendance less than full time, or any
student who is over 19 years of age. The provisions of this paragraph shall
not apply to any student who has an individualized education program.

(d) "At-risk student weighting" means an addend component assigned
to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 72-5151(a), and
amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to the maintenance
of at-risk educational programs by such school districts.

(e) "Base aid for student excellence" or "BASE aid" means an amount
 appropriated by the legislature in a fiscal year for the designated year. The

- 1 amount of BASE aid shall be as follows:
- 2 (1) For school year 2018-2019, \$4,165;
- 3 (2) for school year 2019-2020, \$4,436;
- 4 (3) for school year 2020-2021, \$4,569;
 - (4) for school year 2021-2022, \$4,706;
 - (5) for school year 2022-2023, \$4,846; and

7 (6) for school year 2023-2024, and each school year thereafter, the 8 BASE aid shall be the BASE aid amount for the immediately preceding 9 school year plus an amount equal to the average percentage increase in the 10 consumer price index for all urban consumers in the midwest region as 11 published by the bureau of labor statistics of the United States department 12 of labor during the three immediately preceding school years rounded to 13 the nearest whole dollar amount.

14 (f) "Bilingual weighting" means an addend component assigned to 15 the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 72-5150, and 16 amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to the maintenance 17 of bilingual educational programs by such school districts.

(g) "Board" means the board of education of a school district.

(h) "Budget per student" means the general fund budget of a schooldistrict divided by the enrollment of the school district.

21 (i) "Categorical fund" means and includes the following funds of a 22 school district: Adult education fund; adult supplementary education fund; 23 at-risk education fund; bilingual education fund; career and postsecondary education fund; driver training fund; educational excellence grant program 24 25 fund; extraordinary school program fund; food service fund; parent education program fund; preschool-aged at-risk education fund; 26 27 professional development fund; special education fund; and summer 28 program fund.

(j) "Cost-of-living weighting" means an addend component assigned
to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 72-5159, and
amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to the cost of living
in such school districts.

(k) "Current school year" means the school year during which state
foundation aid is determined by the state board under K.S.A. 72-5134, and
amendments thereto.

(1) (1) "Enrollment" means, except as provided in K.S.A. 2022 Supp.
72-5180, and amendments thereto, *whichever is the greater of*:

38 (1)(A) The number of students regularly enrolled in kindergarten and 39 grades one through 12 in the school district on September 20 of the 40 current school year plus the number of preschool-aged at-risk students 41 regularly enrolled in the school district on September 20 of the current 42 school year;

43 (B) the number of students regularly enrolled in kindergarten and

1 grades one through 12 in the school district on September 20 of the 2 preceding school year plus the number of preschool-aged at-risk students regularly enrolled in the school district on September 20 of the current 3 4 school year, except a student who is a foreign exchange student shall not 5 be counted unless such student is regularly enrolled in the school district 6 on September 20 and attending kindergarten or any of the grades one-7 through 12 maintained by the school district for at least one semester or 8 two quarters, or the equivalent thereof.

9 (2) If the enrollment in a school district in the preceding school year 10 has decreased from enrollment in the second preceding school year, the 11 enrollment of the school district in the current school year means the sum 12 of:;

(A)(C) the enrollment in sum of:

(i) The number of students regularly enrolled in kindergarten and
grades one through 12 on September 20 of the second preceding school
year, excluding students under-paragraph (2)(B), minus enrollment in the
preceding school year of preschool-aged at-risk students, if any clause (ii),
plus-enrollment in the current school year the number of preschool-aged
at-risk students, if any regularly enrolled in the school district on
September 20 of the current school year; and

21 $(\mathbf{B})(ii)$ the adjusted enrollment in the second preceding school year of 22 any students participating in the tax credit for low income students 23 scholarship program pursuant to K.S.A. 72-4351 et seq., and amendments thereto, in the preceding school year, if any, plus the adjusted enrollment in 24 25 the preceding school year of preschool-aged at-risk students who are participating in the tax credit for low income students scholarship program 26 27 pursuant to K.S.A. 72-4351 et seq., and amendments thereto, in the current 28 school year, if any.; or

36 (A)(i) The enrollment *amounts* determined under paragraph (2) 37 subparagraphs (A), (B) or (C); or

(B)(ii) the sum of the enrollment in the preceding school year of the
 number of preschool-aged at-risk students regularly enrolled in the school
 district on September 20 of the preceding school year, if any, and the
 arithmetic mean of the sum of:

42 (i)(a) The enrollment of the number of students regularly enrolled in 43 kindergarten and grades one through 12 in the school district—in on September 20 of the preceding school-year minus the enrollment in such
 school year of preschool-aged at-risk students, if any;

(ii)(b) the enrollment in the number of students regularly enrolled in
 kindergarten and grades one through 12 in the school district on
 September 20 of the second preceding school year minus the enrollment in
 such school year of preschool-aged at-risk students, if any; and

7 (iii)(c) the enrollment in the number of students regularly enrolled in
8 kindergarten and grades one through 12 in the school district on
9 September 20 of the third preceding school year-minus the enrollment in
10 such school year of preschool-aged at-risk students, if any.

11 (4)(2) The *When* enrollment *is* determined under paragraph (1), (2) or 12 (3), except if the school district begins to offer kindergarten on a full-time 13 basis in such school year, students regularly enrolled in kindergarten in the 14 school district in the preceding school year shall be counted as one student 15 regardless of actual attendance during such preceding school year.

16 (3) A foreign exchange student shall not be counted in the enrollment 17 of a school district unless such student was regularly enrolled on 18 September 20 and attending kindergarten or any of the grades one 19 through 12 maintained by the district for at least one semester or two 20 quarters, or the equivalent thereof.

(m) "February 20" has its usual meaning, except that in any year in
which February 20 is not a day on which school is maintained, it means
the first day after February 20 on which school is maintained.

24 (n) "Federal impact aid" means an amount equal to the federally 25 qualified percentage of the amount of moneys a school district receives in the current school year under the provisions of title I of public law 874 and 26 27 congressional appropriations therefor, excluding amounts received for 28 assistance in cases of major disaster and amounts received under the lowrent housing program. The amount of federal impact aid shall be 29 determined by the state board in accordance with terms and conditions 30 31 imposed under the provisions of the public law and rules and regulations 32 thereunder.

(o) "General fund" means the fund of a school district from which
operating expenses are paid and in which is deposited all amounts of state
foundation aid provided under this act, payments under K.S.A. 72-528,
and amendments thereto, payments of federal funds made available under
the provisions of title I of public law 874, except amounts received for
assistance in cases of major disaster and amounts received under the lowrent housing program and such other moneys as are provided by law.

(p) "General fund budget" means the amount budgeted for operatingexpenses in the general fund of a school district.

42 (q) "High-density at-risk student weighting" means an addend 43 component assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to 10

K.S.A. 72-5151(b), and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs
 attributable to the maintenance of at-risk educational programs by such
 school districts.

4 (r) "High enrollment weighting" means an addend component 5 assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 72-6 5149(b), and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to 7 maintenance of educational programs by such school districts.

8 (s) "Juvenile detention facility" means the same as such term is 9 defined in K.S.A. 72-1173, and amendments thereto.

(t) "Local foundation aid" means the sum of the following amounts:

(1) An amount equal to any unexpended and unencumbered balance
remaining in the general fund of the school district, except moneys
received by the school district and authorized to be expended for the
purposes specified in K.S.A. 72-5168, and amendments thereto;

15 (2) an amount equal to any remaining proceeds from taxes levied 16 under authority of K.S.A. 72-7056 and 72-7072, prior to their repeal;

(3) an amount equal to the amount deposited in the general fund in
the current school year from moneys received in such school year by the
school district under the provisions of K.S.A. 72-3123(a), and amendments
thereto;

(4) an amount equal to the amount deposited in the general fund in
the current school year from moneys received in such school year by the
school district pursuant to contracts made and entered into under authority
of K.S.A. 72-3125, and amendments thereto;

(5) an amount equal to the amount credited to the general fund in the current school year from moneys distributed in such school year to the school district under the provisions of articles 17 and 34 of chapter 12 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, and under the provisions of articles 42 and 51 of chapter 79 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto;

(6) an amount equal to the amount of payments received by the
school district under the provisions of K.S.A. 72-3423, and amendments
thereto; and

(7) an amount equal to the amount of any grant received by the
school district under the provisions of K.S.A. 72-3425, and amendments
thereto.

(u) "Low enrollment weighting" means an addend component
assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 725149(a), and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to
maintenance of educational programs by such school districts.

(v) "Operating expenses" means the total expenditures and lawful
transfers from the general fund of a school district during a school year for
all purposes, except expenditures for the purposes specified in K.S.A. 72-

1 5168, and amendments thereto.

(w) "Preceding school year" means the school year immediately 2 3 before the current school year.

4 (x) "Preschool-aged at-risk student" means an at-risk student who has 5 attained the age of three years, is under the age of eligibility for attendance 6 at kindergarten, and has been selected by the state board in accordance 7 with guidelines governing the selection of students for participation in 8 head start programs.

(y) "Preschool-aged exceptional children" means exceptional 9 children, except gifted children, who have attained the age of three years 10 but are under the age of eligibility for attendance at kindergarten. 11 "Exceptional children" and "gifted children" mean the same as those terms 12 are defined in K.S.A. 72-3404, and amendments thereto. 13

(z) "Psychiatric residential treatment facility" means the same as such 14 15 term is defined in K.S.A. 72-1173, and amendments thereto.

16 (aa) (1) "Remote enrollment" means the number of students regularly 17 enrolled in kindergarten and grades one through 12 in the school district 18 who attended school through remote learning in excess of the remote 19 learning limitations provided in K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 72-5180, and 20 amendments thereto.

21 (2) This subsection shall not apply in any school year prior to the 22 2021-2022 school year.

23 (bb) (1) "Remote learning" means a method of providing education in which the student, although regularly enrolled in a school district, does not 24 25 physically attend the attendance center such student would otherwise attend in person on a full-time basis and curriculum and instruction are 26 prepared, provided and supervised by teachers and staff of such school 27 28 district to approximate the student learning experience that would take place in the attendance center classroom. 29

(2) "Remote learning" does not include virtual school as such term is 30 31 defined in K.S.A. 72-3712, and amendments thereto.

32 (3) This subsection shall not apply in any school year prior to the 33 2021-2022 school year.

34 (cc) "School district" means a school district organized under the 35 laws of this state that is maintaining public school for a school term in 36 accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 72-3115, and amendments 37 thereto.

38 "School facilities weighting" means an addend component (dd) 39 assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 72-5156, 40 and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to commencing operation of one or more new school facilities by such school districts. 41 42

"School year" means the 12-month period ending June 30. (ee)

43 "September 20" has its usual meaning, except that in any year in (ff)

which September 20 is not a day on which school is maintained, it means
 the first day after September 20 on which school is maintained.

(gg) "Special education and related services weighting" means an
addend component assigned to the enrollment of school districts pursuant
to K.S.A. 72-5157, and amendments thereto, on the basis of costs
attributable to the maintenance of special education and related services by
such school districts.

(hh) "State board" means the state board of education.

9 (ii) "State foundation aid" means the amount of aid distributed to a 10 school district as determined by the state board pursuant to K.S.A. 72-11 5134, and amendments thereto.

(jj) (1) "Student" means any person who is regularly enrolled in a 12 school district and attending kindergarten or any of the grades one through 13 12 maintained by the school district or who is regularly enrolled in a 14 school district and attending kindergarten or any of the grades one through 15 16 12 in another school district in accordance with an agreement entered into under authority of K.S.A. 72-13,101, and amendments thereto, or who is 17 regularly enrolled in a school district and attending special education 18 19 services provided for preschool-aged exceptional children by the school 20 district.

(2) (A) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the following
shall be counted as one student:

(i) A student in attendance full-time; and

(ii) a student enrolled in a school district and attending special
education and related services, provided for by the school district.

(B) The following shall be counted as 1/2 student:

(i) A student enrolled in a school district and attending special
education and related services for preschool-aged exceptional children
provided for by the school district; and

(ii) a preschool-aged at-risk student enrolled in a school district and
 receiving services under an approved at-risk student assistance plan
 maintained by the school district.

33 (C) A student in attendance part-time shall be counted as that 34 proportion of one student, to the nearest $1/_{10}$, that the student's attendance 35 bears to full-time attendance.

36 (D) A student enrolled in and attending an institution of 37 postsecondary education that is authorized under the laws of this state to 38 award academic degrees shall be counted as one student if the student's 39 postsecondary education enrollment and attendance together with the student's attendance in either of the grades 11 or 12 is at least 5/6 time, 40 otherwise the student shall be counted as that proportion of one student, to 41 the nearest $\frac{1}{10}$, that the total time of the student's postsecondary education 42 43 attendance and attendance in grades 11 or 12, as applicable, bears to full1 time attendance.

2 (E) A student enrolled in and attending a technical college, a career 3 technical education program of a community college or other approved 4 career technical education program shall be counted as one student, if the 5 student's career technical education attendance together with the student's 6 attendance in any of grades nine through 12 is at least $\frac{5}{6}$ time, otherwise 7 the student shall be counted as that proportion of one student, to the 8 nearest $\frac{1}{10}$, that the total time of the student's career technical education 9 attendance and attendance in any of grades nine through 12 bears to full-10 time attendance.

11 (F) A student enrolled in a school district and attending a non-virtual 12 school and also attending a virtual school shall be counted as that 13 proportion of one student, to the nearest 1/10, that the student's attendance at 14 the non-virtual school bears to full-time attendance.

15 (G) A student enrolled in a school district and attending special 16 education and related services provided for by the school district and also 17 attending a virtual school shall be counted as that proportion of one 18 student, to the nearest 1/10, that the student's attendance at the non-virtual 19 school bears to full-time attendance.

20 (H) A student enrolled in a school district and attending school on a 21 part-time basis through remote learning and also attending school in 22 person on a part-time basis shall be counted as that proportion of one 23 student, to the nearest 1/10, that the student's in-person attendance bears to 24 full-time attendance.

25 (I) A student enrolled in a school district who is not a resident of 26 Kansas shall be counted as $\frac{1}{2}$ of a student.

27

This subparagraph shall not apply to:

(i) A student whose parent or legal guardian is an employee of theschool district where such student is enrolled; or

(ii) a student who attended public school in Kansas during school
year 2016-2017 and who attended public school in Kansas during the
immediately preceding school year.

33 34 (3) The following shall not be counted as a student:

(A) An individual residing at the Flint Hills job corps center;

35 (B) except as provided in paragraph (2), an individual confined in and 36 receiving educational services provided for by a school district at a 37 juvenile detention facility; and

38 (C) an individual enrolled in a school district but housed, maintained
 39 and receiving educational services at a state institution or a psychiatric
 40 residential treatment facility.

41 (4) A student enrolled in virtual school pursuant to K.S.A. 72-3711 et 42 seq., and amendments thereto, shall be counted in accordance with the 43 provisions of K.S.A. 72-3715, and amendments thereto. 1 (5) A student enrolled in a school district who attends school through 2 remote learning shall be counted in accordance with the provisions of this 3 section and K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 72-5180, and amendments thereto.

4 (kk) "Total foundation aid" means an amount equal to the product 5 obtained by multiplying the BASE aid by the adjusted enrollment of a 6 school district.

7 (ll) "Transportation weighting" means an addend component assigned 8 to the enrollment of school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 72-5148, and 9 amendments thereto, on the basis of costs attributable to the provision or 10 furnishing of transportation.

11 (mm) "Virtual school" means the same as such term is defined in 12 K.S.A. 72-3712, and amendments thereto.

13 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 72-5132 is hereby repealed.
