AN ACT concerning health and healthcare; relating to sickle cell disease;
 designating sickle cell awareness week; requiring the department of
 health and environment to study and report on topics related to sickle
 cell disease.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

7 Section 1. (a) The third full week in September each year is 8 designated as sickle cell disease awareness week. Sickle cell disease is a 9 genetic disease in which a person's body produces abnormally shaped red 10 blood cells that resemble a crescent and do not last as long as normal, 11 round red blood cells, leading to anemia. Residents of Kansas are 12 encouraged to appropriately observe the awareness week by increasing 13 awareness of sickle cell disease and efforts to improve treatment options 14 for patients.

(b) (1) During at least one regularly scheduled meeting each calendar
year, the advisory council established by the secretary of health and
environment pursuant to K.S.A. 65-180(i), and amendments thereto, shall
devote time to:

(A) Discuss and evaluate whether the available covered medications,
 treatments and services are adequate to meet the needs of medical
 assistance beneficiaries with a diagnosis of sickle cell disease;

22 (B) review information on treatments for sickle cell disease in late-23 stage studies that show promise in peer-reviewed medical literature; and

(C) review the importance of healthcare provider education on the
 disproportionate impact of sickle cell disease on specific minority
 populations.

(2) After the review required by paragraph (1), the department of health and environment, under the guidance of any appropriate advisory council as directed by the secretary of health and environment, may develop a report on the issues described in paragraph (1) to be made available to the public. The department may solicit expert testimony or input on such issues, and such testimony or input may be compiled and published on the department's website.
