

Substitute for HOUSE BILL No. 2494

1 AN ACT concerning school districts; relating to emergency response
2 policies; establishing requirements for cardiac emergency response
3 plans; creating the school cardiac emergency response grant fund.
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5 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

6 Section 1. (a) The secretary of health and environment shall develop
7 statewide standards for cardiac emergency response plans. Such standards
8 shall be developed in accordance with nationally recognized guidelines for
9 implementation of cardiac emergency response plans as promulgated by
10 organizations focused on emergency cardiovascular care.

11 (b) The board of education of each school district shall adopt a
12 comprehensive cardiac emergency response plan, including policies and
13 procedures for cardiac emergency responses for each attendance center
14 operated by the school district, based on the statewide standards developed
15 by the secretary under subsection (a). The board may utilize any materials,
16 documentation, video recordings, training modules and certifications
17 published by organizations focused on emergency cardiovascular care. The
18 cardiac emergency response plan shall include, but is not limited to, the
19 following:

- 20 (1) Establishing of a cardiac emergency response team;
- 21 (2) identifying and implementing the placement of automated
22 external defibrillators;
- 23 (3) identifying roles and responsibilities of school district personnel,
24 local law enforcement agencies and local emergency medical services in
25 implementing the cardiac emergency response plan;
- 26 (4) establishing procedures, including the roles and responsibilities of
27 school district personnel when responding to incidents involving an
28 individual experiencing a suspected sudden cardiac arrest while attending
29 school or at the site of any school-sponsored athletic practice or
30 competition or other school-sponsored activity located in this state whether
31 such site is located on the grounds of the school district or at another
32 location, including, but not limited to:
 - 33 (A) Responding to individuals experiencing a suspected sudden
34 cardiac arrest;
 - 35 (B) summoning emergency medical services;
 - 36 (C) assisting emergency medical service providers; and

1 (D) documenting actions taken during such incident;

2 (5) conducting routine maintenance of automated external
3 defibrillators, including appropriate placement in accordance with the
4 statewide standards;

5 (6) designating school district personnel for training in the use of
6 automated external defibrillators and cardiopulmonary resuscitation
7 during a cardiac emergency;

8 (7) rehearsing cardiac emergency response plans, by simulation, by
9 all athletic directors, coaches, assistant coaches, athletic trainers, school
10 nurses and any other school district personnel designated pursuant to
11 paragraph (6) either prior to the beginning of each athletic season or prior
12 to the beginning of each school year;

13 (8) establishing communication systems with local emergency
14 medical services operating within the school district; and

15 (9) developing a cardiac emergency action plan for school-sponsored
16 events held at a location that is not on school district property.

17 (c) Each board of education shall annually review the cardiac
18 emergency response plan and adopt any changes to such plan as necessary.

19 (d) Each school district shall submit a copy of the adopted cardiac
20 emergency response plan to the secretary of health and environment. If the
21 board of education of such district adopts any changes to such plan, a copy
22 of the amended plan shall be submitted to the secretary.

23 Sec. 2. (a) Each school district shall provide a copy of such district's
24 cardiac emergency response plan to the appropriate local law enforcement
25 agencies, emergency medical services and all school district personnel.
26 Prior to the first instructional day of each school year, a school building
27 administrator shall review the cardiac emergency response plan with all
28 school personnel at each school operated by the school district. The time
29 and date of such review shall be documented as part of the plan. After the
30 last instructional day of each school year, the cardiac emergency response
31 plan shall be revised by all school building administrators, school nurses
32 and appropriate local law enforcement officers and emergency medical
33 services personnel.

34 (b) In accordance with the school district's cardiac emergency
35 response plan, each school district shall maintain an automated external
36 defibrillator in a public and readily accessible location in each school
37 district building used for student attendance purposes. Such locations shall
38 have conspicuous signs indicating the location of each automated external
39 defibrillator.

40 (c) Each coach, including any head coach, assistant coach or aide, any
41 sponsor, including the head sponsor, assistant or aide, of any activity, as
42 defined in K.S.A. 72-7117, and amendments thereto, and any other school
43 district personnel designated pursuant to section 1(b)(6), and amendments

1 thereto, shall receive annual training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and
2 automated external defibrillator administration. At least one individual
3 with such training shall be in attendance at each school-sponsored athletic
4 practice or competition or other school-sponsored activity that occurs in
5 any school district building used for student attendance purposes with
6 access to an automated external defibrillator and first aid supplies. Such
7 training shall be annually reviewed and modified as necessary.

8 (d) Any person who in good faith renders emergency care or
9 treatment pursuant to this section or who provides training as required by
10 this section shall not be held liable for any damages as provided in K.S.A.
11 65-6149a, and amendments thereto.

12 Sec. 3. The board of education of a school district shall implement the
13 cardiac emergency response plan adopted pursuant to section 1, and
14 amendments thereto, as the school district has sufficient unencumbered
15 funds available to implement such plan. A cardiac emergency response
16 plan may be partially implemented as funds are available and as deemed
17 necessary by the board of education.

18 Sec. 4. (a) There is hereby established the school cardiac emergency
19 response grant program to be administered by the department of health and
20 environment. Each school district may submit an application to the
21 secretary of health and environment in such form and manner as
22 prescribed by the secretary for an amount of grant moneys needed by such
23 school district to implement such school district's cardiac emergency
24 response plan adopted pursuant to section 1, and amendments thereto.
25 Each grant application shall include a copy of the current school district
26 cardiac emergency response plan, including all policies and procedures
27 adopted for the implementation of such plan, and a description of the
28 school improvements that the school district determines are necessary for
29 such implementation. The secretary shall review all submitted applications
30 and approve or deny such applications based on whether the applicant
31 school district has demonstrated the necessity of the school improvements
32 described in the application. If the secretary approves an application, the
33 secretary shall determine the amount of moneys to be disbursed to the
34 applicant school district from the school cardiac emergency response grant
35 fund. If the secretary denies an application, then, within 15 days of such
36 denial, the secretary shall send written notice of such denial to the
37 superintendent of such school district.

38 (b) There is hereby established in the state treasury the school cardiac
39 emergency response grant fund to be administered by the department of
40 health and environment. All expenditures from the school cardiac
41 emergency response grant fund shall be used for the disbursement of grant
42 moneys for school improvements in accordance with this section and shall
43 be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the

1 director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by
2 the secretary of health and environment or the secretary's designee. Upon
3 receipt of such grant moneys, the school district treasurer shall deposit the
4 amount of such award in the general fund of the school district.

5 Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after
6 January 1, 2025, and its publication in the statute book.
