AN ACT concerning education; relating to the school sports head injury 1 2 prevention act; requiring schools to establish concussion management teams; standards of care protocols; biennial education; amending 3 4 K.S.A. 72-7119 and repealing the existing section. 5 6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 7 Section 1. K.S.A. 72-7119 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-8 7119. (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the school sports head injury prevention act. 9 10 (b) As used in this section: (1) "School" means any public or accredited private high school,-11 12 middle school or junior high school."Activity" means any school activity 13 or contest in the fields of athletics, music, forensics, dramatics and any 14 other interschool extracurricular activity by students enrolled in any of the grades seven through 12. 15 16 (2) "Athlete" means a student who prepares for or participates in an 17 *extracurricular* activity. 18 (2)(3) "Athletic director" means an individual employed by a school 19 district who is responsible for administering the athletic program of a 20 school. "Athletic director" includes an individual who acts as an athletic 21 director or an assistant athletic director. If a school does not have an athletic director, "athletic director" means the individual designated to be 22 23 responsible for administering the athletic programs of the school. 24 (3)(4) "Coach" means a volunteer or employee of a school district 25 who is responsible for organizing and supervising athletes to teach them the fundamental skills of an-extracurricular activity. "Coach" includes 26 27 head and assistant coaches. 28 (4)(5) "Concussion" means a complex pathophysiological process 29 affecting the brain that is caused by traumatic biomechanical forces. (5)(6) "Concussion management team" means an interdisciplinary 30 team of professionals vested in the education of an athlete when a 31 concussion affects the athlete's ability to learn due to-either an 32 33 extracurricular activity or non-extracurricular activity health condition, including individuals employed by a school district or volunteering at a 34 school to create, implement and supervise concussion management 35 36 policies.

(6) "Extracurricular activity" means an organized school-sponsored.
 or school-sanctioned athletic activity for students, generally held outside.

3 of school instructional hours under the direction of a coach, athletic-

4 *director or band leader, including, but not limited to: Baseball, basketball,* 5 *cheerleading, cross country, football, golf, marching band, soccer,*-

6 softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track, 7 volleyball and wrestling. All interscholastic activities are deemed to be 8 extracurricular activities.

9 (7) "Game official" means an individual who officiates at an 10 extracurricular activity, such as a referee or umpire and includes, but is 11 not limited to, any individual enrolled as a game official by the Kansas 12 state high school activities association.

(2)(8) "Health care Healthcare provider" means a person an
 individual licensed by the state board of healing arts to practice medicine
 and surgery.

16 (9) "Licensed athletic trainer" means an individual who is licensed 17 by the state board of healing arts as an athletic trainer under the 18 provisions of K.S.A. 65-6906, and amendments thereto, and whose 19 practice includes schools and extracurricular activities.

20 (10) "Licensed school counselor" means an individual who is 21 employed by a school district and who is licensed by the state board of 22 education as a school counselor.

(11) "Licensed speech-language pathologist" means an individual
 who is licensed by the Kansas department for aging and disability
 services and practicing in a school setting as an employee of a school
 district or special education cooperative.

(12) "Nurse" means an individual licensed by the board of nursing
who is practicing in a school setting as an employee of the school district
or volunteer of the school.

30 (12)(13) "Parent" means a natural parent, a stepparent, a guardian
 31 or a foster parent of a student.

(13)(14) "Return-to-learn protocol" means an evidence-based
 reintegration program consistent with the best standards of care
 guidelines designed to return the athlete to school and the classroom
 setting for the purpose of formal learning.

36 (14)(15) "Return-to-play protocol" means an evidence-based
 37 reintegration program consistent with the best standards of care
 38 guidelines designed to return the athlete to-extracurricular activity
 39 practice before formal competition.

40 *(15)(16)* "School" means any public or accredited nonpublic high 41 school or middle school, including home school entities.

42 (c) The state board of education, in cooperation with the Kansas state 43 high school activities association, shall compile information on the nature

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and risk of concussion and head injury including the dangers and risks
 associated with the continuation of playing or practicing after a person an
 individual suffers a concussion or head injury. Such information shall be
 provided to school districts for distribution to coaches, school athletes and
 the athletes' parents or guardians of school athletes.

6 (1) Schools shall establish a concussion education program for 7 parents, athletes and school personnel to review the school policies and 8 procedures governing the prevention and management of concussions. Such program shall include, but not be limited to, the prevention and 9 management of concussions, dangers and risks associated with 10 concussions, signs and symptoms of concussions, return-to-learn and 11 return-to-play protocols and school policies and procedures for 12 13 concussion preventive management.

(2) Schools shall establish policies and procedures governing the
 prevention and management of concussions of students. Policies and
 procedures shall address concussions occurring in <u>extracurricular</u>
 activities and may be applied to all concussions of students.

18 (3) Schools shall establish a return-to-learn protocol for any athlete 19 who has sustained a concussion. The return-to-learn protocol shall 20 recognize that a student who has sustained a concussion and returned to 21 school may need formal or informal accommodations, modifications of 22 curriculum and monitoring by medical or academic staff until the 23 athlete has fully recovered.

(4) The school concussion management team shall establish a
return-to-learn protocol based on scientific evidence-based practices
consistent with the United States centers for disease control and
prevention guidelines and the Kansas state high school activities
association guidelines for the student's return to the classroom.

(5) Schools shall appoint a concussion management team to establish
 a return-to-play protocol based on scientific evidence-based practices
 consistent with the United States centers for disease control and
 prevention guidelines and the Kansas state high school activities
 association guidelines for the student's return to play.

(4) The school concussion management team shall establish a return to-learn protocol based on scientific evidence-based practices consistent with the centers for disease control and prevention guidelines and the Kansas state high school activities association guidelines for the student's
 return to the classroom.

39 (5)(6) The membership of the concussion management team-shall 40 may include to the extent possible, but-shall not be limited to, the:

- 41 *(A)* Licensed athletic trainer, if employed or contracted by the school 42 district;
- 43 *(B) athletic director;*

- (C) designated teacher;
- 2 (D) licensed school counselor:
- 3 (E) school administrator; and
- 4 (F) nurse, if any;

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- (G) licensed speech-language pathologist; and
- (H) any other licensed individual deemed appropriate by the school.

7 (6)(7) Schools shall appoint a designee from the concussion 8 management team to supervise the persons responsible for compliance 9 with the return-to-play and return-to-learn protocols. The person who has 10 supervisory responsibilities shall not be a coach of an<u>extracurricular</u> 11 activity.

12 (7) Schools shall establish a return-to-learn protocol for any athlete 13 who has sustained a concussion. The return-to-learn protocol shall-14 recognize that a student who has sustained a concussion and returned to 15 school may need formal or informal accommodations, modifications of-16 curriculum and monitoring by medical or academic staff until the athlete 17 has fully recovered.

(8) An athlete may not participate in any-extracurricular activity
 competition or practice session until completely integrated in school
 without accommodation related to a concussion.

(9) The following individuals shall complete, at least biennially, a
 concussion training program approved by the state board of education and
 the Kansas state high school activities association:

24 (A) Coach;

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- (B) licensed athletic trainer;
- 26 (C) licensed school counselor;
- 27 (D) game official;
- 28 *(E) nurse;*
- 29 (F) athletic director; and

30 (G) licensed speech-language pathologist; and

(H) school marching band director, whether employed by the school
 district or a volunteer serving in such capacity.

(d) A schoolAn athlete may not participate in any sport *extracurricular activity* competition or practice session unless such athlete
and the athlete's parent or guardian have signed; and returned to the
school; a concussion and head injury information release form. A release
form shall be signed and returned each school year that a student an athlete
participates in sport competitions an extracurricular activity competition
or practice sessions session.

40 (e) If a school athlete suffers, or is suspected of having suffered, a
41 concussion or head injury during a sport competition or practice session,
42 such school athlete immediately shall be removed from the sport43 competition or practice session. (1) An athlete shall be removed

1 immediately from an extracurricular activity competition or practice session if one of the following individuals believes that the athlete might 2 3 have sustained a concussion arising from such competition or practice 4 session:

(A) Coach;

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(B) healthcare provider;

(C) game official;

(D) licensed athletic trainer:

9 (E) the athlete's parent or another person with the legal authority to make medical decisions on the athlete's behalf; 10

(F)the athlete: or

12 (G) any other person deemed appropriate under the school's return-13 to-play protocol.

14 (f) Any school athlete who has been removed from a sport-15 competition or practice session shall not return to competition or practice 16 until(2) The athlete shall not return to an-extracurricular activity 17 competition or practice session until the athlete:

18 (A) Is evaluated by a health care healthcare provider and the health 19 eare healthcare provider provides such athlete a written clearance to return 20 to play or practice. If the health care healthcare provider who provides the 21 clearance to return to play or practice is not an employee of the school 22 district, such health care healthcare provider shall not be liable for civil 23 damages resulting from any act or omission in the rendering of such care, 24 other than acts or omissions constituting gross negligence or willful or 25 wanton misconduct;

26 (B) has successfully completed each requirement of the return-to-play 27 protocol established by the school, which is necessary for the athlete to-28 return to play; and

29 (C)—has successfully completed each requirement of the return-to-30 learn protocol established by the school necessary for the athlete to return 31 to learn; and

32 (C) has successfully completed each requirement of the return-to-33 play protocol established by the school necessary for the athlete to return 34 to play.

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- (g) This section shall take effect on and after July 1, 2011. 36 K.S.A. 72-7119 is hereby repealed. Sec. 2.
